These achievements are to be celebrated and shared through the European Riverprize for the first time, presented in Vienna, on September 12, 2013.


Open to all organisations, the IRF European Riverprize is awarded to the river basin that can demonstrate outstanding management of water resources and builds on the European pedigree of previous Thiess International Riverprize winners; the Thames, the Danube, the Mersey and the Drome.

An all-European panel of experts from professional, academic and scientific disciplines assesses applications based on an integrated approach to river management, evidence of social and economic gains, a long-term vision and demonstrated, outstanding achievements in river ecology.

During this United Nations Year for Cooperation in Water, the IRF is inviting a select group of thought and practice leaders to participate in the management, funding and promotion of the event. The Riverprize has a unique prestige and an enduring legacy. This is an opportunity to be the first to engage in a landmark program that builds stronger relationships with the businesses, governments and civil society organisations that share your organisation's commitment to sustainable water and river basin management.

In order to highlight the importance of integrated river basin management in Europe, the IRF has formed a partnership with the International Commission for the Protection of the Danube River (ICPDR) and the European Centre for River Restoration (ECRR) to deliver the IRF European Riverprize.

The IRF European Riverprize will celebrate successful approaches that have overcome the challenges to river restoration, ecosystem health, water quality and climate change within the social and political context of the European continent.

Judged by a panel of European experts and administered from the IRF Europe office in Vienna, the first European Riverprize will be awarded at the ECRR and RESTORE annual conference in Vienna on Thursday 12 September, 2013.

Applications will be assessed based on a documented river management framework, evidence of social and economic gains, an integrated approach to river management, long-term vision and demonstrated, outstanding achievements in river ecology.

Participation is open to all organisations, including business, government and civil society, who are engaged in the sustainable management of waterways from the Ural Mountains to the Atlantic Ocean. The winner of the IRF European Riverprize will automatically qualify as a finalist in the Thiess International Riverprize in the following year.

Businesses, Governments, Foundations and other interested parties willing to support the European Riverprize are being sought after to:


